Commissioner Court Order Extending Coronavirus-COVID -19 Disaster Declaration

Whereas, On March 18, 2020, Jim Hogg County Judge Juan Carlos Guerra issues a Declaration of Local Disaster for Jim Hogg County resulting from the coronavirus- covid-19 health emergency; and

Whereas, the conditions necessary for the declaration of a state of disaster continue to exist; and

Whereas, 418.108 of the Texas Government Code provides that a local state of disaster may not be continued for a period of more than seven days without the consent of the governing body of the political subdivision.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE COMMISSIONER'S COURT OF JIM HOGG COUNTY:

- 1. That the state of disaster proclaimed for the County of Jim Hogg by the County Judge on March 18, 2020, shall continue until terminated by order of the Commissioner's Court.
- 2. This order is passed as an emergency measure and pursuant to 418.108 and the Jim Hogg County Emergency Management Plan and shall become effective on the 25th day of March 2020.
- 3. This order shall be given prompt and general publicity and promptly filed with the county clerk.



Order of the County Judge

ESTABLISHING CURFEW

Pursuant to Chapter 418 of the Texas Government Code, a **curfew** is hereby established for all areas of Jim Hogg County Texas from 10:00 PM until 5:00 AM each day to go into effect on Thursday, March 26, 2020. All individuals shall remain in or on personal property and avoid traveling on any public road or highway during this period of curfew. Individuals who are traveling to or from a place of employment or are assisting with emergency operations at the requiest of County Sheriff or Emergency Management Coordinator are exempt from the requirement of this order. Individuals traveling through Jim Hogg County, Texas due to an emergency necessity are exempt from the requirements of this order. This order does not apply to health care providers or to a licensed food company providing food and other consumables to others. Individuals who work for a company categorized as "essential" by the CDC are also exempt. These individuals should carry a letter from employers showing proof that they are part of the "essential" workforce. This order does not prohibit any person from leaving his or her home to seek necessary medical or emergency care.

The intent of this Order is to protect the physical health and well-being of Jim Hogg County citizens and to slow the spread of COVID-19 to the maximum extent possible while safeguarding the Constitutional liberties of Jim Hogg County citizens by utilizing common restrictive measures and encouraging the highest level of personal responsibility. This curfew is a proactive measure being taken for the health and safety of the citizens of Jim Hogg County, Texas. If you have any questions or need further guidance regarding this order, you may contact the Jim Hogg County Sheriff's Department at 361-527-3710.

A person who violates this order is subject to a fine up to \$500.00 (Class C Misdemeanor).

ESTABLISHING YOUTH CURFEW

Pursuant to Chapter 418 of the Texas Government Code, a **youth curfew** is hereby established for all areas of Jim Hogg County Texas from 8:00 AM until 4:00 PM each day to go into effect on Thursday, March 26, 2020. Youth curfew is mandated for all youth under the age of 17 or under required school attendance. All youth shall remain at home during these hours and must also comply with the community curfew of 10:00PM to 5:00AM. This order does not prohibit any person from leaving his or her home to seek necessary medical or emergency care.

The intent of this Order is to protect the physical health and well-being of Jim Hogg County citizens and to slow the spread of COVID-19 to the maximum extent possible while safeguarding the Constitutional liberties of Jim Hogg County citizens by utilizing common restrictive measures and encouraging the highest level of personal responsibility. This curfew is a proactive measure being taken for the health and safety of the citizens of Jim Hogg County, Texas.
